REQUIRED PARTICIPANT NUMBERS

Minimum of 10 applications as of October 28, 2024 (Deadline for application submission)

Minimum of 10 participants as of November 25, 2024 (Successful applicants to confirm their places)

Maximum of 24 participants

Note: There is a chance that this seminar might be cancelled due to further COVID circumstances.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must:

- be an Australian teacher of primary levels K-Y6 or a New Zealand teacher of primary levels Y1-8 (including a teacher who is going to start teaching at a primary school from 2025).
- be currently teaching Japanese a minimum of 3 hours per week (if you are on leave etc. and not currently teaching but would like to participate, please consult with us beforehand).
- not be a native or near-native Japanese speaker.
- be able to read Hiragana and Katakana without any difficulty.
- be at least JLPT N5 level of Japanese language proficiency.
